Curriculum Coverage:

Inquiry:

This year we are using the below whakatauki as our theme:

He moana pukepuke ekengia e te waka A choppy sea can be navigated

This term we will be focussing on the concept of 'pukepuke' the roughness of the sea (the choppy sea). We will be integrating this concept as part of our transition for 2023. We will be looking at ways that others have transitioned to new places and strategies they have used to make this successful. The idea is to help our tamariki and give them strategies to successfully transition on their next journey -(year 6's to intermediate, year 5's becoming our year 6's and our year 4's becoming our year 5's) and how to manage the changes that may come about.

Maths:

Numeracy

Number Knowledge

- Know simple fractions in everyday use. (Yr 4)
- Know fractions and percentages in everyday use. (Yr 5 & 6)

Algebra

Patterns and Relationships

- Generalise that whole numbers can be partitioned in many ways. (Yr 4)
- Find rules for the next number in a sequential pattern. (Yr 4)
- Generalise the properties of addition and subtraction with whole numbers. (Yr 5/6)
- Connect members of sequential patterns with their ordinal position and use tables, graphs, and diagrams to find relationships between successive elements of number and spatial number. (Yr 5/6)

Statistics

Probability

- Investigate simple situations that involve elements of chance, recognising equal and different likelihoods and acknowledging uncertainty. (Yr 4)
- Investigating simple situations that involve elements of chance by comparing experimental results with expectations from models of all the outcomes, acknowledging that samples vary. (Yr 5/6)

This term we are going to revisit all the language that has been taught over the years and use these in authentic contexts. Below is a list of what we will be covering:

Physical and Health Education:

This term we are continuing with our morning fitness routine. Every morning we will be doing a relay fitness activity as a syndicate on the courts. This is a great way for everyone to not only start the day with some physical activity but to come together at the start of the day.

We will continue focusing on building relationships and showing empathy towards others through PE and sport, as well as fair play and good sportsmanship. We will be using the te whare tapa wha model as our theme.

This term we will be participating in the Seedlings Yoga for schools programme. Each class will have 2 45 minute sessions every week (Mondays and Wednesdays).

We will be working on our Athletics in weeks 1, 2 and 3 getting ready for our syndicate athletics day on Friday 28th October.

Beach Education

This term Tawhai school will be partaking in a beach education programme run by surf lifesaving. There will be more information coming home about this closer to the time.

Homework:

Mathletics is a Board funded resource that we would like to encourage children to continue to use at home as part of their home learning, and to try to earn as many points as they can. Teachers can also assign various tasks at times, to specific children. We would also like to encourage children to read each night. We will be continuing our concept of home learning that links into Hauora (Well Being). Each class may have their own little tasks coming home.

Another good thing that you can do is to have discussions with your child about what they have been learning about at school.

Stationery

Please check in with your child and see if they might require some more pencils or any other stationery items to see them through to the end of the year.

Headphones

If your child has a pair of headphones at home that they like to use, they are welcome to bring these to school to use when we are using devices for our learning.

<u>Summer Term and hats</u>

With term 4 being a summer term, we require students to wear a broad brimmed or bucket hat as our school sun protection policy states. Please check with your child that they have a sun hat at school. New hats can be purchased from the office.
