# **Curriculum Coverage:**

Key competencies/6 C's: are the capabilities people have, and need to develop, to live and learn today and in the future. This term we will be focusing on Citizenship - I am starting to explore and develop interest in local and global issues.

Inquiry Unit: This term we are continuing to explore our whakatauki for the year: Poipoia te kākano kia puāwai - Nurture the seed and it will blossom. We will be supporting tamariki to grow their knowledge by exploring, innovating and building. We will be investigating science concepts around the living world.

PB4L/Self Regulation: We will continue to support children to identify how they are feeling, are their "engines" high, just right, low? How can they change their emotions to suit the environment they are in? All emotions are ok, however we need to understand the best way to express them and the impact they have on ourselves and others. Please contact your classroom teacher if you would like more information regarding our Self Regulation Programme.

Literacy: We will be continuing to explore literacy each day in the classroom. Please encourage and support your child's learning by reading and writing with them, listening to them read, and encouraging them to share their ideas (by talking,drawing and/or writing). Your child should be bringing home a reading book most nights and some sight words to learn (reading and or spelling).

Numeracy: Numeracy is another daily focus in our classroom. Children are supported to understand Mathematical concepts and strategies. Where possible we try to make the connection to Mathematics in everyday life. Please support your child at home to increase their knowledge and skill by counting with them, cooking with them, and discussing word problems with them. Some students have Mathletics activities to support their learning.

## Some important reminders:

- Arrival at school: The ideal time for your child to be at school is between 8:30am and 8:45am Teachers are not required to be in their classrooms until 8:30am, prior to that they may be touching base with colleagues, in meetings or getting themselves organised for the day. If you need to send your child to school earlier, please contact Kelly Club for supervised care - Vanessa Chatfield, Mobile: 0274 185131
- After school: School finishes at 3.00pm. Please see your child's classroom teacher if you need to discuss after school arrangements.
- Messages for your children: Please ensure your child knows in advance about after school arrangements. Obviously there will be times when you need to get an urgent message through to your child, but I am sure you can understand how difficult it can be for Kelly to field and follow up the many phone calls she gets at the end of the day.
