School Board Chair, Jaydy Marsh did a fantastic job organising the Whath Group with a grant from the Hutt City Creative Communities NZ































Jamíe Gray who is a firefighter based at Trentham come along to the Kura to talk to our Tamaríkí about fire safety














Room's 6 g 11 went down to the pool to learn about water safety!
























On November 14th it was World Diabetes Day so everyone dressed in Blue to show their support as we have tamariki with the condition.














A wonderful 3 days of action, fun, and skills as 3 of the hubs battled it out for the prestigious Tawhai Cup!

Our Year 6's enjoyed an evening of kai, kanikani, and katikati at the Leavers' Dinner & Prize giving down at the RSA!







